Do not use

if you are allergic to aspirinor any other pain reliever/fever reducer this product for at least 7 days after tonsillectomy or oral surgery unless directed by a doctor

Ask a doctor before use if

- stomach bleeding warning applies to you
- you have a history of stomach problems, such as heartburn
- you have high blood pressure, heart disease, liver cirrhosis, or kidney disease
- you are taking a diuretic you have asthma

Ask a doctor or pharmacist before use if you are

taking a prescription drug for

- gout
- diabetes
- arthritis

Stop use and ask a doctor if

- an allergic reaction occurs. Seek medical help right away
- you experience any of the following signs of stomach bleeding: feel faint, vomit blood, have bloody or black stools, have stomach pain that does not get better
- pain gets worse or lasts more than 10 days
- redness or swelling is present
- new symptoms occur
- ringing in the ears or loss of hearing occurs

If pregnant or breast-feeding

ask a health professional before use. It is especially important not to use aspirin during the last 3 months of pregnancy unless specifically directed to do so by a doctor because it may cause problems in the unborn child or complications during delivery.

Keep Out of Reach of Children
